Everyone has a different experience with education. The question is, how does one's culture and background affect that experience? Because let's face it, the world is getting smaller. People are traveling and living in different places, and carrying multiple ethnic identities.

My name is Sonia Paul, and I work as an Assistant Language Teacher for English in Shizuoka City, the capital of Shizuoka Prefecture. In 2010, I received a research grant to create a radio project investigating that question.

I talked with many teachers and even more students. Japanese students and ones from other countries. All the interviews were conducted right here, in Shizuoka City.
